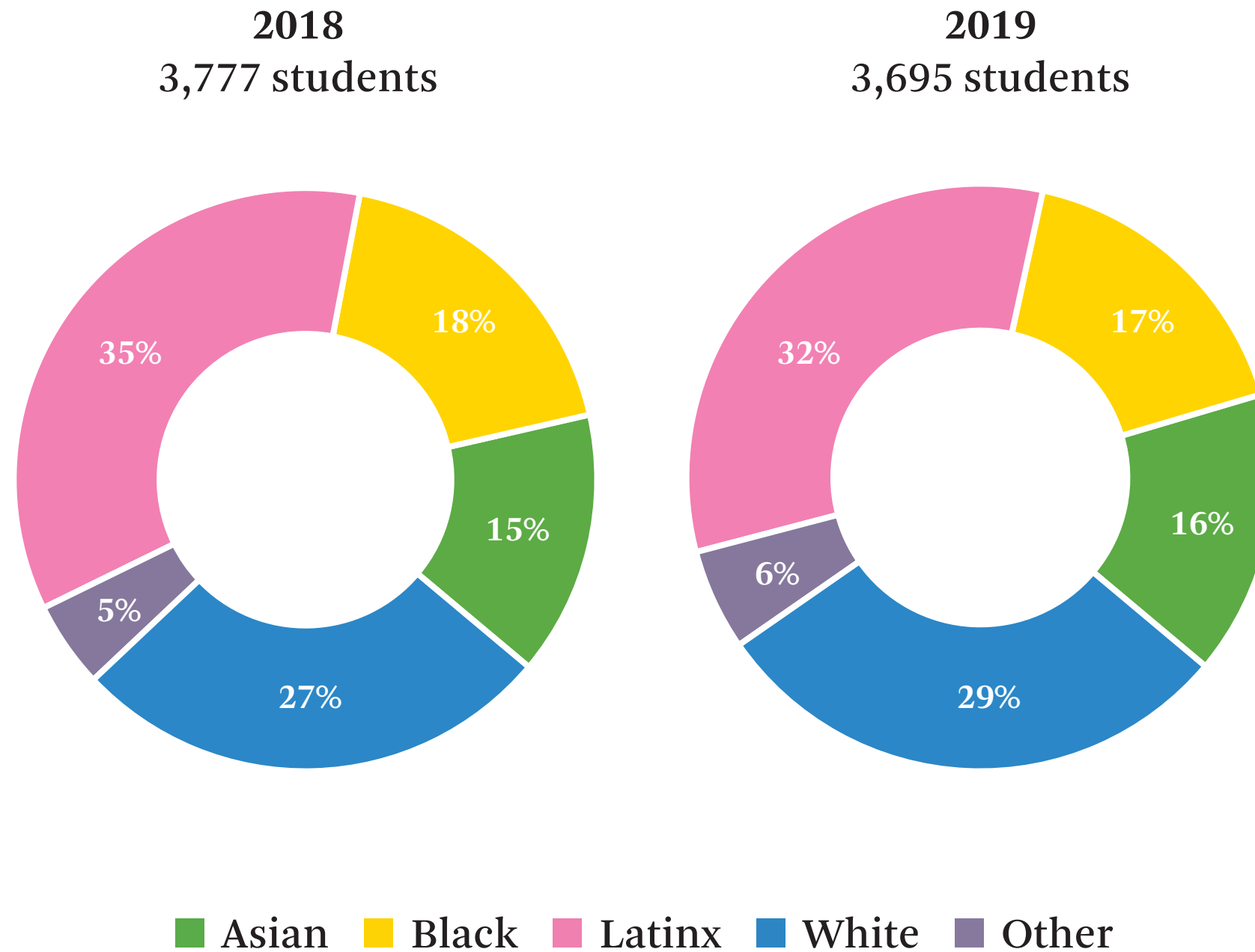

Application Data for Fall 2019 Admissions

Applicant Demographic Information, 2018 and 2019

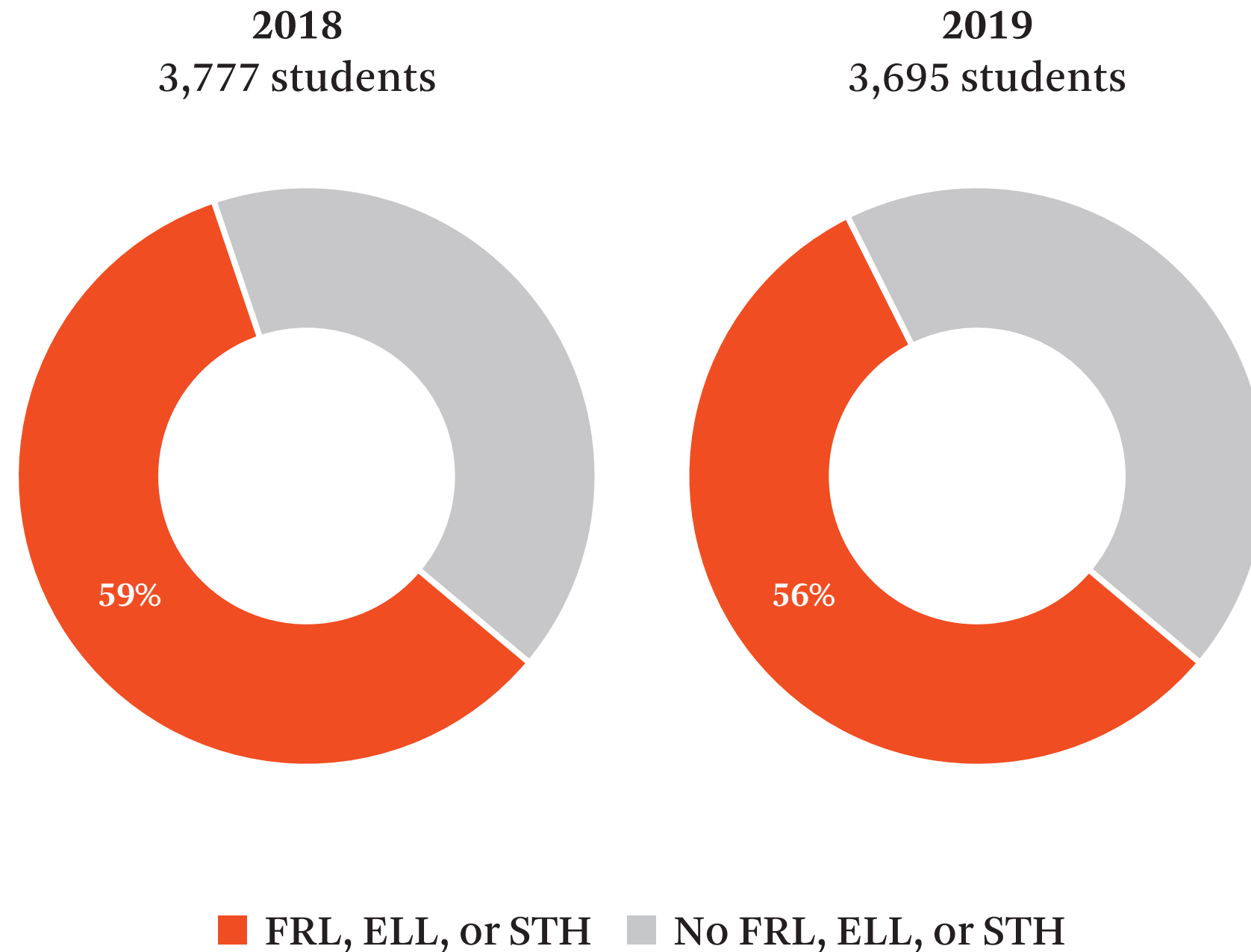
The number of D15 applicants decreased by 82 students between 2018 and 2019. Slightly fewer Black and Latinx students applied to schools in D15 in 2019 than in 2018. At the same time, the number of White and Asian students who applied to schools in D15 increased slightly.

Applicant Priority Status, 2018 and 2019

In both 2018 and 2019, the number of students with D15 priority was a little more than half of all students who applied to schools in D15. Priority status refers to the admissions priority for students who qualify for free & reduced lunch (FRL), are English Language Learners (ELL), or live in temporary housing (STH).

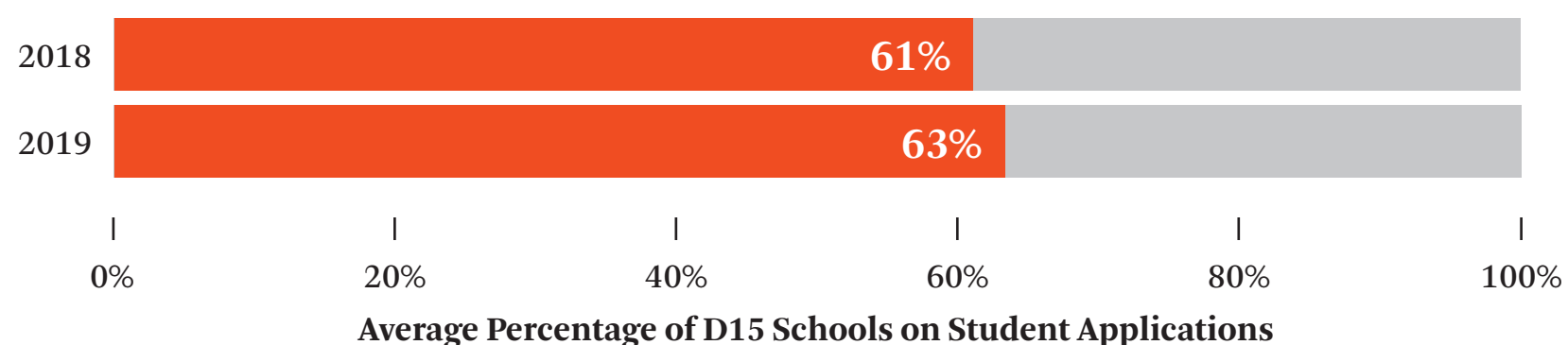
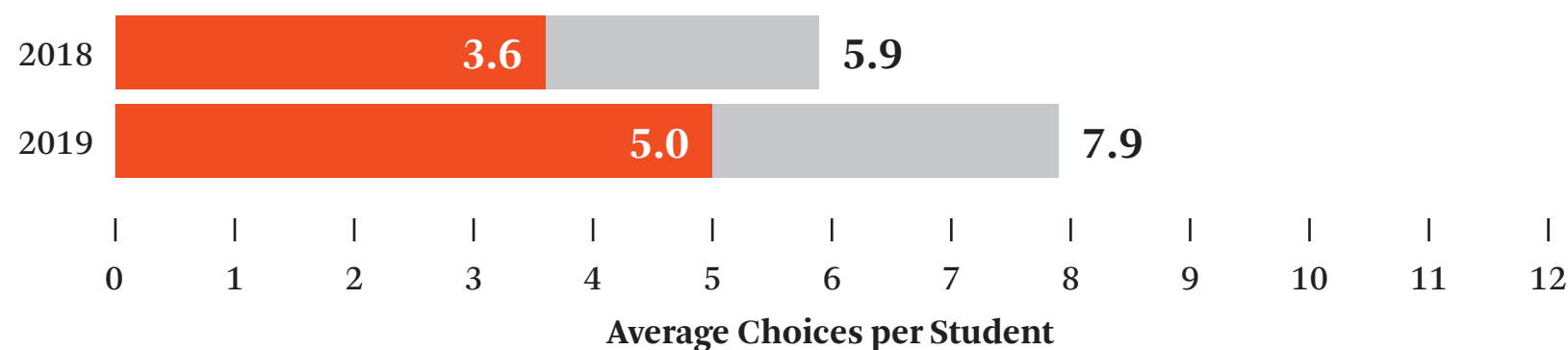

Average D15 Choices per Student, 2018 and 2019

In 2019, on average, students listed more D15 schools and non-D15 schools on their applications than in 2018. The average number of D15 choices listed on a student's application increased across all racial demographics.

On average, students with D15 schools among their choices applied to 7.9 schools in 2019, of which 5.0 were in D15. By contrast, in 2018 students with D15 schools among their choices applied to only 5.9 schools on average, of which 3.6 were choices in D15. As such, the share of student applications to schools in D15 increased slightly between 2018 and 2019, from 61% to 63%.



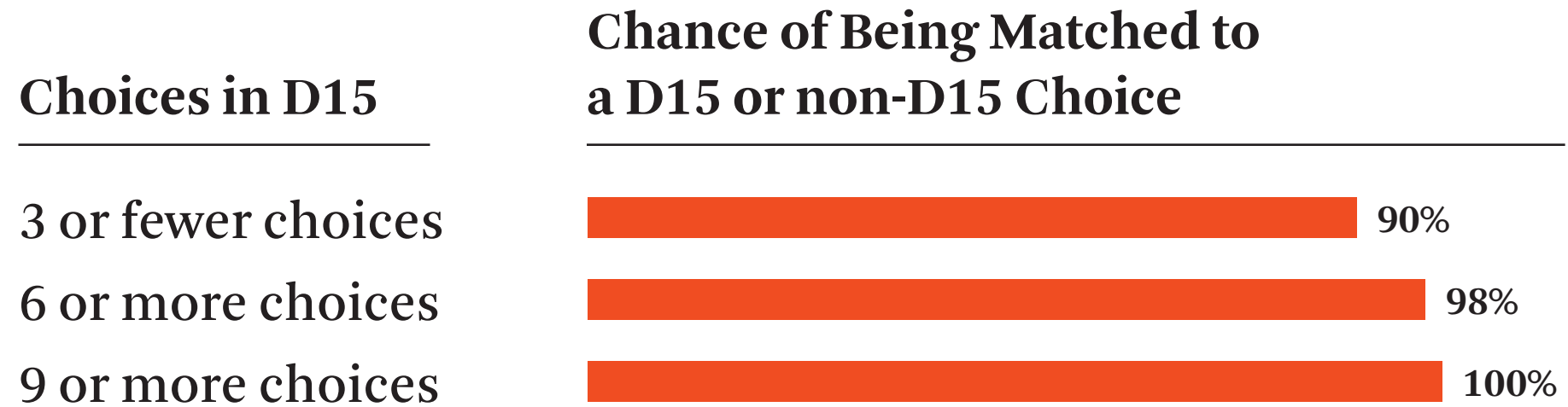
■ Choices in D15 ■ Choices to Schools Outside D15

Percentage of Students Who Matched to a Chosen School, 2019

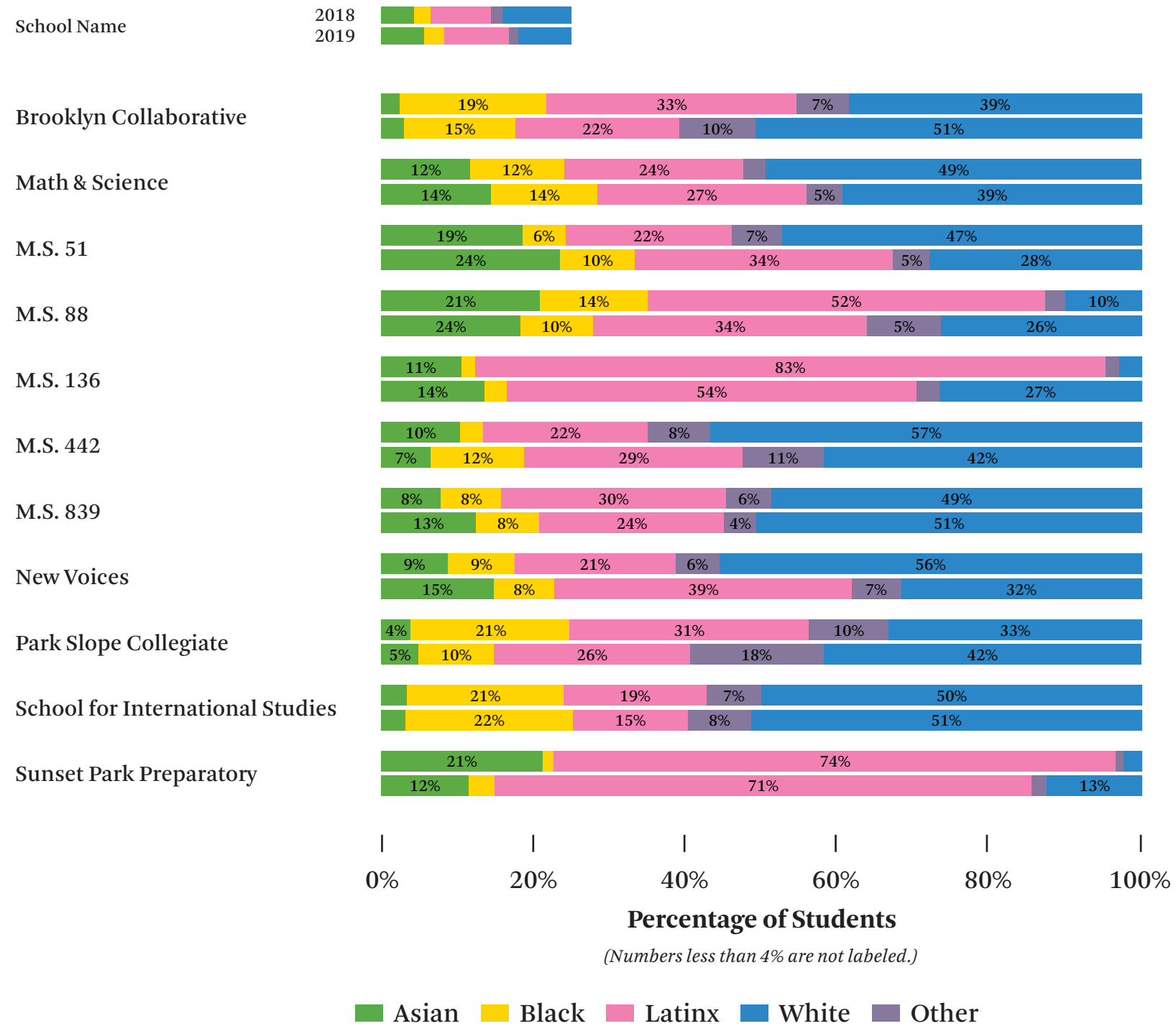
Listing more than three D15 schools on their application increased a student's chances of being matched to one of their choices in 2019. All students who listed nine or more D15 schools on their applications received an offer to a school they applied to.

Middle School Offers by Race, 2018 and 2019

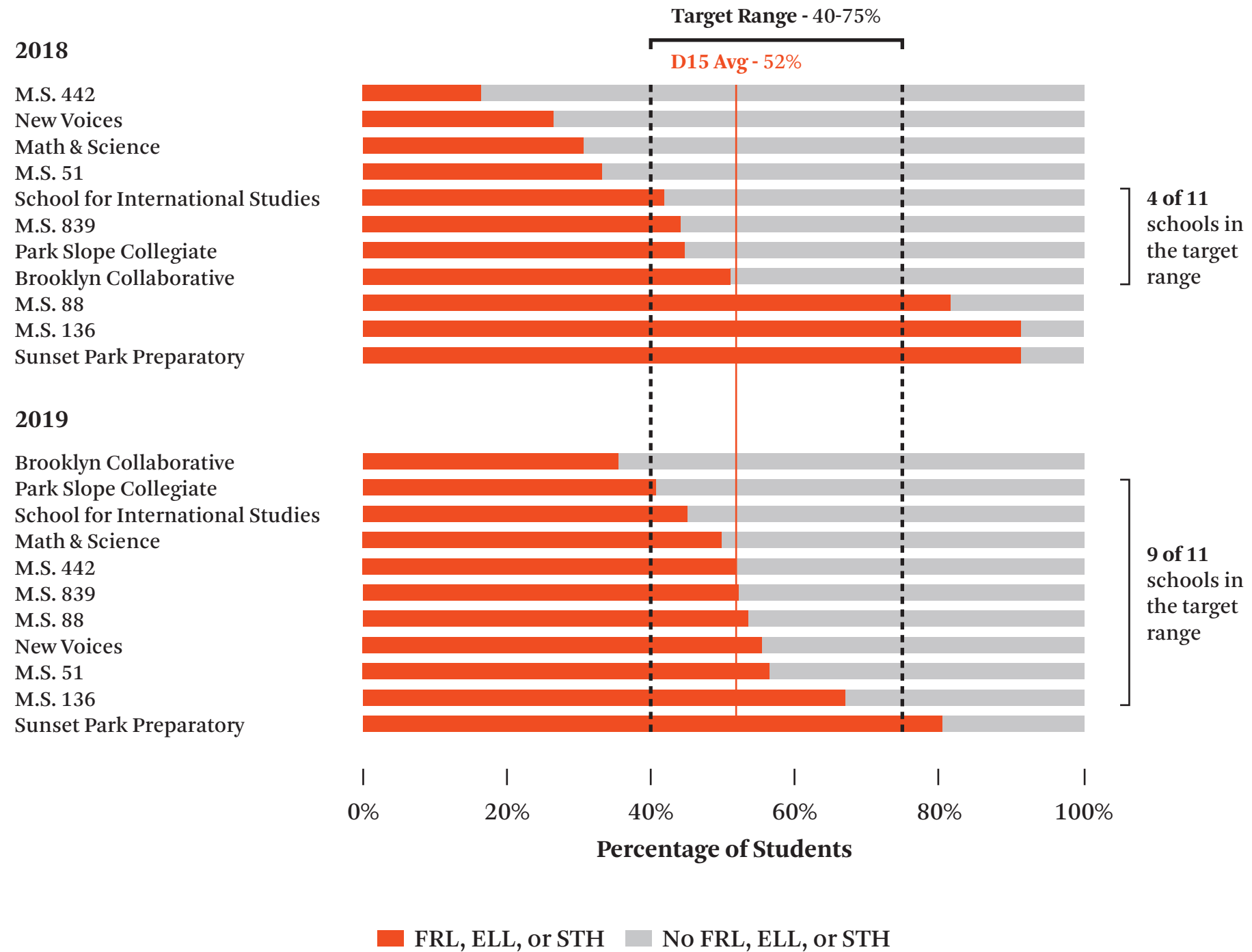
Between 2018 and 2019, the percentage of D15 offers by race changed at most D15 middle schools.

Middle School Offers Overall, 2018 and 2019

The percentage of D15 offers by priority status changed at D15 schools between 2018 and 2019, moving towards the D15 average.
